

SNOW MAINTENANCE INFORMATION

The MD contracts out for the bulk of our snow and grader maintenance, the contractors as well as the areas they service is outlined below:

- Bow Corridor Snow Maintenance Paved Roads
- Central Snow Maintenance Paved Roads
- Burnt Timber Road Snow Maintenance

KJU Contracting Inc.

- North Ranchlands Gravel Maintenance Area.
- Central Gravel Maintenance Area.
- South Ranchlands Gravel Maintenance Area.

As we proceed into another winter season the MD would like to remind all residents, Industrial lot owners and contractors alike of a few important items to keep in mind:

When snow events occur, our contractors are dispatched to clear the streets in keeping with our Snow Maintenance policy T-19 that can be found on our website at: <https://www.mdbighorn.ca/> please assist us by ensuring vehicles are parked in a manner that does not impede with the effective clearing of the streets.



While our maintenance contractors strive to try and not create issues for residents; it is important to note that the MD is not responsible for any residual snow left behind due to plowing. Depending on the amount of snow being dealt with, the residual snow that is left can result in anything from “next to nothing” to a considerable amount.

It is unlawful to deposit snow collected from residential and industrial properties and deposit it on to the adjacent road right of way, penalties for doing so could result in fines up to \$115.00 plus clean up costs, should the MD have to remove the snow. All snow collected from privately owned properties must be contained on site or hauled away.



Once snow storage throughout the streets start to fill up, the MD Roads Department will deploy to load and haul away the snow in order to reestablish the space required for more snow storage. During this operation all snow, curb to curb throughout the street is collected and hauled as such, the MD asks, residents and business owners to assist us by ensuring your vehicles are parked off the street to facilitate for unobstructed access so that our forces can remove all the snow from each street. Keep watch for notice board signage that is usually put out the week prior to the cleanup occurring.
